

TASA donates 16 tons of food to artisanal fishermen and vulnerable families

Lima, April 4th, 2020.- In line with its permanent commitment to the families that form part of the communities where it operates, the Peruvian fishing company TASA, delivered more than 10,000 kilos of frozen mackerel to thousands of artisanal fishermen and low-income families during the first week of April. This was done through each of the municipalities in the areas where it operates.

The company also delivered 950 baskets with groceries (rice, sugar, milk, oil, vegetables and noodles). The donation of fish and baskets made by TASA in the various ports of the country totals 16 tons of food and has benefited more than 13,000 families. Additionally, the Producer Associations (APRO for its Spanish acronym), in which the company participates, have delivered 2,300 additional food baskets.

On the other hand, TASA has granted an important contribution of money through Peru's Confederation of Private Business Institutions (CONFIEP for its Spanish acronym) and the National Fisheries Society, for the purchase of monitors and respirators to assist patients affected by Covid-19.

“This is a difficult time for the country and for the world, but it is also an occasion to show the best of us. The country is united, and the solidarity of Peruvians has reappeared. TASA is committed to the economic and social development of Peru, particularly in the areas where it operates.
